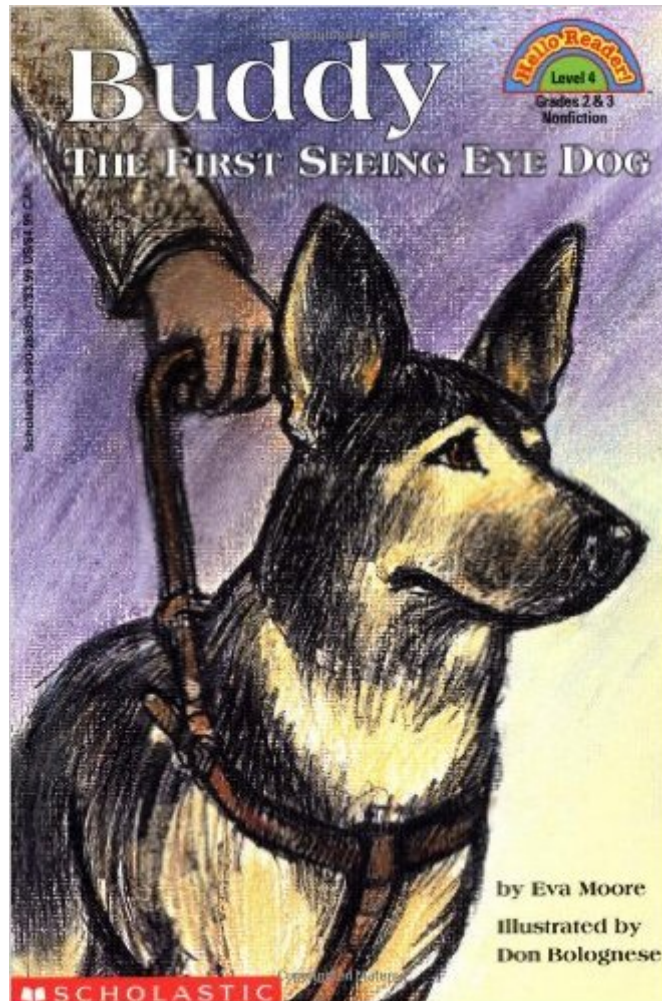

Morris Frank and Buddy. Another true story of the first Guide Dog for the Blind in the USA. Morris Frank trained with Buddy overseas in the Swiss Alps by Dorothy Eustis and Jack Humphrey. Good book; teaches how the blind (Morris) was trained to feel different movements of the dogs harness to know what the dog is doing, where to walk, when to stop, start, turn. Morris is taught how to work with Buddy, how to care for her. Buddy saves Morris's life on a old county road. Protects his money! Then it's back to the USA where Morris and Buddy 'equal partners' with help from Dorothy and Jack train other people to be teachers and open the first Guide Dog School; The Seeing Eye. Thousands of blind people were trained to use and care for a guide dog. The Idea of using guide

dogs for the blind originated in Germany. Jack Humphrey was trained in a school in Germany. Possibly other countries, people in the past worked this way with dogs. Dog (wolf) and humans since ancient times!

The characters are Buddy, the first seeing eye dog, his master that was blind, the person who trained Buddy and the person who trained Buddy's master. It took place in a big field, on a boat and in his master's home. Buddy was trained to be a seeing eye dog. His master was trained to know how to take care of Buddy. This book is awesome! It was exciting and fun and it had a dramatic ending.

My great nieces and great nephews love this book. I sent it to one of them and they have shared the book and seemed to have loved it. I kept one book for me (I ordered 2) because this is the story I read when I was in 2nd grade that inspired me to become a trainer of guide dogs...which I was successful at.

This book is an excellent chronicle of The Seeing Eye, yet written in language a child can understand. The examples of exciting events punctuate and enliven the text.

My 1st grade son's teacher read this book in class, and he loved it so much he wanted me to buy it. The book is challenging enough for him to read, but he was able to read it with minimum help the first time. Ever since, he's been reading it on his own. He will sit down and read it for an hour at a time.

I read this story with my daughter and we both loved it. Learning about the history of seeing eye dogs was a 'eye opener'. The writing and pictures were very good. You will not be disappointed.

This is a great book! I used it for guided reading. Kids were engaged and learned a lot of background knowledge about guide dogs. It also helps students to be sensitive to the needs of others. It does a great job describing how difficult life would be for people without sight before guide dogs were even an option. Narrative nonfiction chapter book. Fountas and Pinnell level M.

If you love dogs or even not, this one is a very sweet story about a real dog. Great pictures. Written well for a young reader.
