


The book was found

Synopsis

But who's been keeping the letters all these years? And how did Dad actually die? As the answers to these mysteries are revealed, Mike and his family find a way to heal and move forward at last.

This was a wholesome, well-written, engaging, coming of age story. Though the subject was serious, its tone was not dark like so many books targeted at a young adult audience. I am considerably beyond that age group and thoroughly enjoyed the book!

A teen starts getting letters from his dad, a soldier who was killed seven years earlier in Afghanistan. This novel follows the boy through struggles at school and at home, aided by guidance

from his late father. This is a five-star book that will keep you turning the pages. It will especially be appreciated by football fans. While there is a great deal of detail about football plays, you don't have to be a sports fan to appreciate the bonding, camaraderie and sense of belonging that being part of a team can bring, whether in high school or the military. This is aptly portrayed in this coming-of-age story.

Sixteen year old Mike has a heavy load to carry in his young life. His father died in Afghanistan when he was 7 years old. Now older, he receives letters set before his Dad died. Where are these letters and a CD coming from? He also has to deal with his mother who is living in the past and mourns the death of her husband. Sister, Mary is typical sibling, but comes through in the end. A nice girl at school is a good friend for Mike. This book deals with family relationships and peers / playing football without mother's permission. His escape is working for Derek at his farm. All of these issues come to a peak towards the end of the book. Excellent written and SO glad that there isn't a swear word in the Book. Recommended for church libraries.

As a high school teacher, I see so many young men drifting through the day with no guidance from a father figure. For 15-year-old Mike, who lost his father in Afghanistan, daily life is its own struggle. Bullies, a lack of self-confidence, no clear path in life has left Mike feeling confused until letters from his dead father arrive and show Mike that life isn't what he thought. With a set of missions (such as to ask a girl out), Mike now has a clear goal. Wanting to play football, Mike must move past his mother's disapproval and find his own identity.

This is one of my all time favorite books. *Well You're Reading This* is a book about a normal teenager named Mike gets mystery letters from his dad who had died five years earlier in the war in Afghanistan. In the story Mike gets goals every week from his dead father like *Join the football team* or *Date a girl*. He learns to have fun while he still is a teenager but, he still doesn't know what happened to his dad and how he died. I loved this book mostly because of the war and the sports involved in it.
